



Sue Parks Bryant

October 22, 1933 - August 31, 2011

Mrs. Sue Parks Bryant, 77, of Gordon, passed away August 31, 2011 in Valdosta, GA. She had been a resident in an extended care facility since February, 2011, due to complications from a car accident. Sue was born in Ellijay, Ga, to Morris and Edith (Miller) Parks, but lived most of her adult life in Gordon. She earned a degree in biology education in 1954 and a Master's degree in education from Georgia College and State University. She worked briefly at the Gordon Bank and 26 years in the Wilkinson County School System as a librarian, mainly in the primary school. Sue was a member of the Gordon United Methodist Church and a past member of the Gordon Woman's Club. She loved her family, dogs, books, cooking, travel, and nature. Sue is predeceased by her husband of 35 years, Benton Bryant. She is survived by her daughters Angela Gibbs of Valdosta and Ginger (Paul) Panico of Pataskala, OH, son Robert Gibbs of Arlington, VA, grandchildren Nora and Ben Gibbs, and beloved dog Annie. A Memorial Service will be held on Saturday, October 8, 2011 at 11AM at the Gordon United Methodist Church, 128 Main Street, Gordon, GA, with the Reverend Doug Mays officiating.
